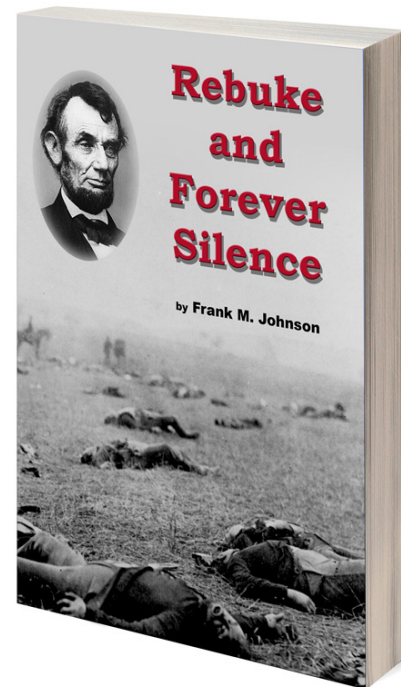




Local Author Releases New Book  
***“Rebuke and Forever Silence”***

Local historian and author, Frank Johnson has released his new book titled: *“Rebuke and Forever Silence.”* This revealing book focuses on the true agenda of President Abraham Lincoln and his 19th century Republican Party and their plan for a *“White Christian Dynasty”* in the Western Territories of the United States. Unlike the Republican Party of today, the original Republican Party was commonly referred to as the Party of Lincoln and was most often associated with bringing an end to slavery. What few Americans realize is for the first ten years of its existence, the Republican Party defended slavery in the States where it existed and in 1861 Abraham Lincoln was complicit in creating a proposed Constitutional Amendment which would have made slavery perpetual and irrevocable. Most importantly, it shows how the continued struggle over the power of government has defined American politics; liberal ideologies which contend that the government can solve all the problems of the people and conservative ideologies which contend that the people can solve all the problems of the government. This incredible story is both revealing and shocking. It highlights issues in America’s past that few historians have ever focused on; including the fight to prevent a “Bill of Rights” from being added to the Constitution.
